

The Student Wellbeing Framework








Wellbeing for schools sets out to enable students to be healthy, happy, engaged and successful.

We can enable environments that increase the likelihood that children develop social competence and academic success




What does the evidence tell us?

The five most effective strategies are:

- Engagement
- Rules
- Routines
- Praise and feedback
- Consistent consequences for misbehaviour

Research suggests that these are most effective when they are:

- Part of a school-wide consistent approach
- Built on positive teacher-student relationships



Behaviour Management Flowchart






Being 'on green'

At Darlington, we are Safe, Respectful Learners






Moving to red
