This is a fantastic opportunity for prospective families to explore our vibrant school, meet our enthusiastic student leaders, and begin forging connections within our community.

**High potential and gifted education (HPGE)**: The School Development Days in Week 1 saw teachers engage with professional learning to support our understanding and implementation of High Potential and Gifted Education (HPGE) for individual students and groups across the creative, intellectual, physical and social emotional domains. ### Changes to school report templates/format - information for families Kindergarten to Year 6

Starting in Semester 1, 2025, the NSW Department of Education will introduce new school reports that are easier for parents to read and understand. The NSW Department of Education has developed these reports for Kindergarten to Year 10. The templates respond to feedback from parents and carers who wanted clearer, more concise information on their child's progress, while helping schools streamline the reporting process.

These changes, aim to provide a clearer picture of how your child is doing in school. The reports will include progress in all subjects, including important areas like English, mathematics, and other key learning areas.

Teachers will provide comments about your child in English, mathematics, and a general comment section, helping you understand what your child is doing well and where they might need support.

For Kindergarten students, the general comment will cover Creative Arts, HSIE (Human Society and Its Environment), PDHPE (Personal Development, Health and Physical Education), and Science and Technology, giving a complete picture of their progress.

The new reports will feature an achievement scale with clear descriptions, allowing you to understand your child's learning progress better achievement scale and descriptions

Parent-teacher interviews will still be an important way to discuss your child's progress in detail, giving you the opportunity to ask questions and explore how to support their learning journey. We welcome your feedback and questions about the new report format, as your thoughts are valuable to us.

With these updates, we hope to make it easier for you to understand how your child is doing in school, and we appreciate your support as we implement these changes.

Semester 1 reports will be coming home in Week 10 of this term.
